

#### Admissions:

#### **Eligibility Criteria**

#### **B.Com. Degree Course (Bachelor of Commerce)**

A candidate who has passed the two-year Pre-University Examination conducted by the Karnataka Pre University Board or any other examination considered as equivalent there to shall be eligible for admission to the B.Comprogram

A candidate who has passed Diploma in Business Administration examination conducted by the Directorate of Technical Education; Karnataka may be considered eligible for admission to First Year B Com Degree course.

A candidate who has passed Diploma in Secretarial / Commercial Practice conducted by the Board of Technical Education; Karnataka may be considered eligible for admission directly to Second Year (III Semester) B. Com. Degree course.

#### **BBA Degree Course (Bachelor of Business** Administration)

A candidate who has passed two-year Pre-University Examination conducted by the Karnataka Pre University Board or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to the B.B.A course.

#### BCA Degree Course (Bachelor of Computer Application)

A candidate who has passed the two-year Pre-University Examination conducted by the Karnataka Pre University Board or any Other examination considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission.

A candidate who has passed JODC [Three-year Diploma in Engineering of Government of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to First Year degree course.

#### **Duration of Courses**

Unless otherwise mentioned, the duration of each course is a period of three years (six semesters), each academic year comprising of two semesters, each semester comprising sixteen weeks of class work, excluding the duration of examinations. The course should be completed within six years from the year of joining, failing which the candidate has to join the course afresh.

#### NEP

After the introduction of NEP, the duration of course is flexible with multiple entry and exit points ranging from one year to four years

#### **Institution Timings**

#### a) General Timings :9.30am. to 3.30pm.

It might vary in the case of remedial classes and activities carried out by clubs, cells and committees.

## Admissions:

#### **Dress Code:**

- Boys shall wear Formals /Jeans & decent T-shirt with collar / Formal or sports shoes. Chappals are not allowed.
- Girls shall wear Churidar/Salwar Kameez / Jeans and Kurtas. Skirts shall be avoided.
- Not Recommended for Students
- Torn attire/ Sleeveless T-shirts / Tops / T-shirts with obscene words or language, Trousers with more pockets

Note: During the technical presentations and in placement season, student should come in formals only.

#### Identity Card:

Each student will be provided with an Identification Card with his / her photo and name on it. The students have to compulsorily wear the ID card inside the Campus. Students are also informed to wear their ID card while representing the institution in other College / University events such as sports, cultural and other academic activities.

#### Academics

Each department is headed by a senior professor. The staff members of each department are allotted additional portfolios such as class coordinator, time-table in charge, placement coordinator, sports coordinator, cultural coordinator, project coordinator, mentors counsellors and so on. Curriculum and syllabus are framed by the affiliated University and suitably improvised by the faculty handling the respective subjects.

#### Attendance regulations

- a) Students are expected to report to the campus by
  9.20 am and under no circumstances can a student
  leave the campus before 3.30 pm
- However, in the case of emergencies, such as genuine health related problems, students shall be allowed to leave.
- Any other form of emergency requires verification from the parent.
- b) Attendance will be taken for every hour and the same will be digitized at the end of the day.
- c) Attendance will be considered for computing Internal Assessment Marks.
- d) 75% attendance is a basic requirement for theory classes and practical sessions. Students are not eligible to appear for the End Semester Examinations, if their attendance is below the required percentage.
- e) Half day leave or permission is not permitted unless under extraordinary circumstances.
- f) Day-wise and monthly-wise attendance report of the student will be shared to parent mobile number by the Attendance recording section.

g) If leave is required for more than two days on medical grounds, parents should intimate department about the duration of leave required through letter with the necessary proof attached. A student who avails on duty has to take prior permission from the department head and the. necessary documents have to be submitted to mentor/ counselor after attending the event.

#### Feedback:

Feedback from students is periodically collected by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). Online feedback system is in place to take the feedback on academic support and other facilities of the campus.

#### Scholarships and Awards:

Scholarships and freeships are awarded for deserving students by the Management.

College toppers and University toppers are given cash awards for their performance

#### Usage of Mobile Phones:

Students are informed to restrict the use of mobile phones in classrooms, laboratories, examinations halls and corridors Disciplinary action will be taken for improper usage of mobile phone in the campus which may result in confiscation of the mobile phone.

#### Ragging & Sexual Harassment

The institution has a Anti Sexual Harassment Cell and Anti Ragging Cell that strictly views any cases of ragging and sexual harassment.

Ragging and sexual harassment is a punishable offence under IPC and UGC regulations 2009 and will result in rustication and even lead to imprisonment. Students are advised to refrain from such abusive practices in their own interest.

Affidavit of Student: A student during the admission process has to file an affidavit along with his parents/guardian's signature, stating that he will not indulge in ragging other students directly or indirectly.

#### Alcohol, Tobacco and Drugs Consumption
