National Education Policy 2020

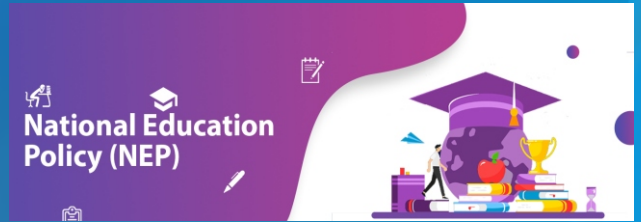
Introduction : Education is fundamental for achieving full human potential, developing an equitable and just society, and promoting national development. Providing universal access to quality education is the key to India's continued ascent, and leadership on the global stage in terms of economic growth, social justice and equality, scientific advancement, national integration, and cultural preservation. Universal high-quality education is the best way forward for developing and maximizing our country's rich talents and resources for the good of the individual, the society, the country, and the world. India will have the highest population of young people in the world over the next decade, and our ability to provide high-quality educational opportunities to them will determine the future of our country.

The vision of this policy : This policy envisions an education system rooted in Indian ethos that contributes directly to transforming India into an equitable and vibrant knowledge society, by providing high quality education to all, and thereby making India a global knowledge superpower.

NEP 2020 ADVANTAGES : Achieving full human potential through education.

The NEP 2020 has been introduced to bring monumental changes in the Indian education scenario. The following are the advantages of the new education policy 2020.

- **Increased expenditure on education:** The increased spending on education, from earlier 3% to 6% now, will bring the much-needed funds, focus and prioritisation in the education sector.
- **Reduced exam stress:** The changed school structure will reduce the stress of board exams and will channelize students' focus towards practical skills and vocational learning.
- **Flexibility to choose subjects:** Students have broader options to learn now. They have the option of choosing any subject combination from Arts, Commerce and Science and exploring a multidisciplinary arena of education.
- **Universalisation of education:** NEP 2020 is making education a basic right. It will bring back many children back to the educational institutes and truly universalize education for children aged 3-18.
- **Introduces kids to coding:** Introduction of computers and coding in class 6 upgrading the learning process.



• These policies are in tandem with the changing times and cater to the present and future demands of the world we thrive in.

NEP 2020 DISADVANTAGES: Areas of Improvement

However, there are some points which have received criticism from some sections of society. The following are some of the disadvantages of the new education policy 2020.

Teaching in the mother tongue will be challenging: Teaching the fundamental subjects in the mother tongue will be a hassle as India has 22 scheduled languages and innumerable dialects. The course material will need to be converted to these languages first, and then the requirement of skilled teachers to implement this.

Widening the gap between learners: As the mother tongue is going to be the preferred medium of instruction till class 5, the introduction of English after 5th standard in government schools will widen the gap with the private schools that have been providing education in English since the beginning.

Challenge of digital divide: The digital divide

present in India is even more extreme in rural areas where not everyone can afford smart phones. The problem is further compounded by the poor IT infrastructure of government-run schools, which will create implementation issues in the digitization of education. However, the issues with these policies can be changed with due government intervention.

Conclusion: In NEP 2020, the pros overpower the cons. There are more good aspects of NEP than less appreciative ones. And with timely recognition, they will also be addressed, and NEP will prove beneficial to both students and the education sector.

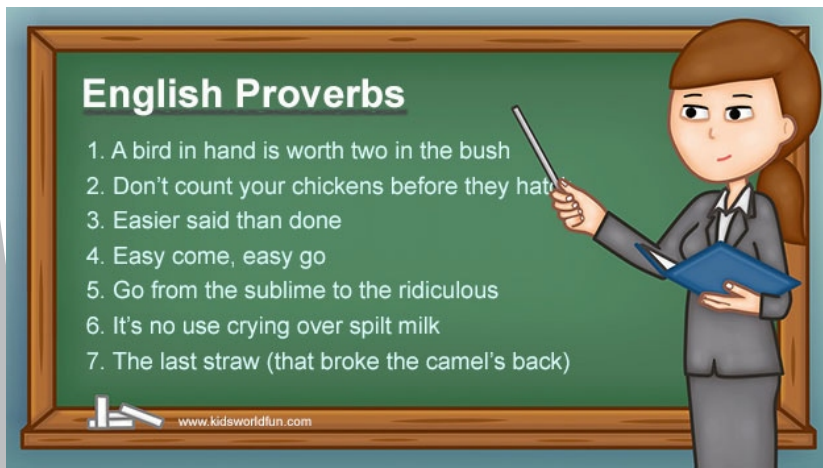
Eating junk food sometimes and not on a regular basis is manageable, but consuming it regularly can harm tour body. So people must try limit eating junk food for a better future.

Teaching English through Idioms

Teaching idioms might seem nerve-racking, especially if your students have never heard any of them before. Idioms are a common part of speech, though. Getting your students familiar with them early on can help them

communicate more naturally and give them a deeper understanding of the English language.

It doesn't have to be complicated or difficult to teach idioms. With these tips and resources, teaching idioms to your students will be a piece of cake.

Only introduce a few idioms at a time

Don't overwhelm students by throwing lists of phrases at them. Even if they are all common, useful idioms, students aren't going to remember a few dozen things from one lesson. Instead, introduce a few idioms at a time. It can also help to keep them all related to a theme. For example, focus one lesson on a few animal-related idioms, such as “work like a dog,” “dog days,” “raining cats and dogs,” and “the cat's out of the bag.”

Use stories

Telling a story can help students understand and remember the meaning behind the words. “Kill two birds with one stone,” for example, lends itself well to a simple story. You can then have your kids discuss the meaning of the phrase, and come up with other ways that they could “kill two birds with one stone.”

You can also use stories that contain a lot of idioms, such as the [Amelia Bedelia books](#). This series is rich in idioms and puns, and with a main character who often completely misinterprets them. Reading and discussing it with your students can be a lot of fun, and a great way to get them thinking about idioms and their meanings.

Use visuals

Whether it's pictures or acting something out, visuals are another great way to convey meaning and help students remember what they've learned. After all, a picture is worth a thousand words, and actions speak louder than words. Drawing or acting out idioms can make a great review game, too. Have students draw or act out an idiom while the other students try to guess it. Use conversations

Introducing idioms through simple conversations can give students an idea of how the idioms are used in real-life situations. It's also a good exercise for inferring the meaning of an unfamiliar idiom based on context.

Use the idioms regularly in the classroom

Keep track of the idioms that you've taught your students, and make it a point to use them every now and then in class. This will not only help students remember the phrase and its meaning, but will also help them get a feel for how the idiom is used in everyday speech.

Keep it fun and light

Teaching idioms is about helping the students communicate and understand conversational English. Whatever activities or games you do, keep it low-stress and focus on getting your students comfortable with understanding and using the idioms that they know.
